Looking forward we have decided to subsidize bus trips for away games and our Captains will be encouraging members to visit other district clubs that we as a group have not done so before. Smaller club Open Days will be targeted.

We have just established "Equality of Prizes" starting from January 2025. This means equal prizes for members regardless of gender. Our Ladies now receive the same prizes as men. As a result the Ladies fields in our competitions have seen a sudden increase in numbers. It is hoped that this trend will continue as we as a club support equality in golf.

We have had a steady growth in field sizes throughout 2024 because of the hard work of our committee and therefore, we have been able to improve prize allocations, making Vets a more attractive option for Hervey Bay Golfers.
